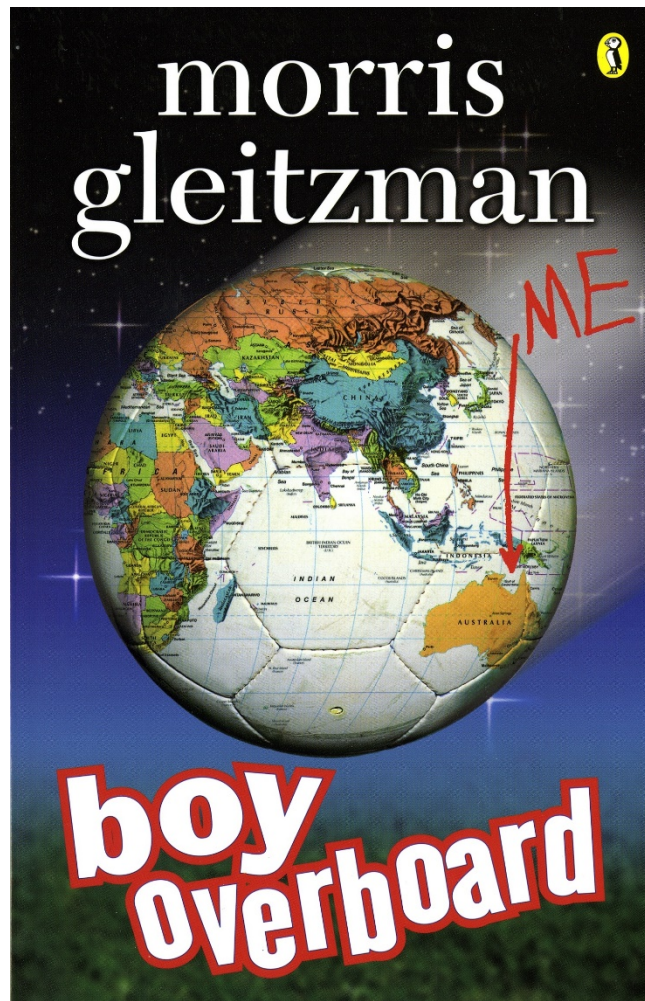

Ancestors	An explosive mine hidden underground; explodes when stepped on or driven over.	
Fugitives	A person from whom one is descended or who lived in the past, or a person who came before. Your great great-grandfather is an example of an ancestor .	
Wreckage	to treat (someone) cruelly or unfairly especially because of race or religious or political beliefs.	
Persecute	A person who flees or tries to escape: such as. a : a person who flees a country or location to escape danger (such as war) or persecution : refugee	
Landmines	the remains of something broken down or destroyed digging through the storm's debris	
Debris	Broken and disordered parts or material from something wrecked.
