Anh Do


Anh Do is a famous comedian. He is well known for his books. He is the writer of both the WeirDo! and Hot-Dog books.

The Vietnam War

In the late 1800s, the area that is now Vietnam was called French Indochina. It under French control for a long time, but in 1945 Ho Chi Minh defeated the French. The country was split into two parts: North and South Vietnam.

North Vietnam wanted the whole country to be communist. Communism is a government idea where everybody owns the property, and people get only what they need. Everyone must do their fair part to help.

In December 1960, an army called National Liberation Front, commonly called the Viet Cong, came to challenge the South Vietnamese government. A civil war started control of South Vietnam.
