1a) Lola collected 58 cans. Jill collected 5 cans. How many cans did Lola and Jill collect altogether?
1b) Altogether Lola and Jill collected 74 cans. Jill collected 8 cans. How many cans did Lola collect?

1a) Lola collected 98 cans. Jill collected 9 cans. How many cans did Lola and Jill collect altogether?
1b) Altogether Lola and Jill collected 125 cans. Jill collected 38 cans. How many cans did Lola collect?
