
"Friends of c and k"

Tuesday—Phonics

Short Vowel, Double Consonant— ll, ff, ss & zz

When a word ends with one the following sounds /l/, /f/, /s/ or /z/, after a short vowel, you need to double the consonant. When writing the word you must end it by doubling the consonant./ll/, /ff/, /ss/ or /zz/. This is called a **digraph**. A digraph is two letters that make one the one sound .

Instructions: The pictures bellow all end with a double consonant. Your job is to find the right digraph and write it to finish the word. Remember a digraph is two letters that make the one sound, so they will need to share a box.

ll —usually at the end of the word and after a short vowel.


le— we would usually use le at the end of a word that has two syllables, but we need to remember to double the consonant eg: puddle, bubble.

Pasta Necklace

Equipment /Tools:

- Uncooked pasta (the hollow ones to be specific)
- Ziplock bags
- A cotton thread or string
- Food colouring
- Rubbing alcohol
- Tray
- Tissue Papers



Instructions:

- 1 Put the dried pasta into the ziplock bags.
- 2 Add 2 to 3 drops of food colouring and 1 drop of rubbing alcohol into the bags. Seal them and shake well till each pasta piece gets completely coated.
- 3 Place the tissues papers on the tray and then empty the coloured pasta on them for drying.
- 4 Cut the cotton thread of the desired length and start stringing the pasta pieces one by one.
- 5 Tie both the sides of the string once you have reached the end.



How to make Salt Dough

Mix together:

- * 2 cups of plain flour
- * 1 cup of salt
- * Up to 1 cup of water

(add the water in slowly as you may need less)

Knead the mixture into a dough and get creating


