Chimpanzees are mammals that can be found across central and West Africa. They live in tropical rainforests and can also be found in woodlands and grasslands.



Chimpanzees usually sleep in trees and build nests out of leaves. They like to eat fruit and plants as well as insects, eggs and nuts. Although they normally walk on all fours, chimpanzees can stand and walk upright. They use their long arms, hands and fingers to climb trees and swing from branch to branch.



Cheetahs are the fastest mammals on land. They live and hunt mainly in open grasslands and bushy areas in parts of Africa and the Middle East Asia.

Cheetahs eat small and medium size animals, such as birds, hares, warthogs, gazelles and young wildebeest. They have good eyesight which they use to hunt their prey. Cheetahs use their strong claws and powerful jaws to catch their prey.
