Tuesday Maths

Hide and Go Find

- 1. Hide an object somewhere around your house.
- 2. Have a parent or sibling stand in front of you.
- 3. Give them directions to help them find the object using language like "Turn around and walk 3 steps away from me", "Turn around and walk 4 steps towards me", "Turn right and walk 2 steps towards the window", "Turn left and walk 2 steps backwards towards me".
- 4. After they find the object, let them have a turn to hide it and give you directions to find it.

Walk and Talk

You can play this game if you are outside on a walk, getting some exercise.

- 1. Ask an adult to spot an object and give you clues to guess what it is using its position.
- 2. You can ask questions like, "is it behind the fence?" or "is it in front of the café?"

I Spy Position

Play a game of "I spy", but instead of guessing a word that begins with a certain letter, use the object's position as a clue.

For example: "I spy with my little eye, something in front of the TV" or "I spy with my little eye, something next to the fridge".
